Handspun Scarf

Handspun Scarf is perfect for small amounts of handspun. I used it for my 2006 Knitting Olympics project to showcase my handspun cashmere. Since I didn't have many yards, I was looking for a simple yet elegant pattern that didn't require many stitches and that would block well to maximize yardage.

Finished Size

Depends on yarn and needles used. Sample 1: 4" wide x 42" long

Sample 2: 5" wide x 66" long

Yarn

Handspun 2-ply yarn; the pattern width will probably work best with fingering to worsted weight yarn.

Sample 1 was knit with 2 oz / 135 yards of handspun 2-ply cashmere.

Sample 2 was knit with 2.8 oz / 195 yards of handspun 2-ply Finn.

Needles

Use needles to get desired fabric. Lace should be knit more loosely than stockinette and will stretch when blocked.

Both samples were knit with US #8 needles.

Directions

The first and last 5 sts form the selvedge. See abbreviations before starting. Loosely cast on 22 sts.

Row 1 (RS): k1, $[ktbl, ptbl] \times 2$, k2tog, k5, yo, k1, yo, k2, ssk, $[ptbl, ktbl] \times 2$, k1.

Rows 2 and even rows: k1, [ptbl, ktbl] x 2, p12, [ktbl, ptbl] x 2, k1.

Row 3: k1, [ktbl, ptbl] x 2, k2tog, k4, yo, k3, yo, k1, ssk, [ptbl, ktbl] x 2, k1.

Row 5: k1, [ktbl, ptbl] x 2, k2tog, k3, yo, k5, yo, ssk, [ptbl, ktbl] x 2, k1.

Row 7: k1, [ktbl, ptbl] x 2, k2tog, k2, yo, k1, yo, k5, ssk, [ptbl, ktbl] x 2, k1.

Row 9: k1, [ktbl, ptbl] x 2, k2tog, k1, yo, k3, yo, k4, ssk, [ptbl, ktbl] x 2, k1.

Row 11: k1, [ktbl, ptbl] x 2, k2tog, yo, k5, yo, k3, ssk, [ptbl, ktbl] x 2, k1.

Repeat rows 1-12 to desired length, ending with row 11 or 5. BO all sts loosely in pattern.

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Chart

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Finishing

Weave in all ends. Wet block, stretching to open up the pattern.

Abbreviations

ktbl: k through back of st ptbl: p through back of st

yo: yarn over

k2tog: k 2 sts together

ssk: slip next 2 sts as if to k ea st, return sts back to left needle and k them tog
